

Landyscul, we arrived in due time, found Bro J. T. Evans, at Mrs Hutton's  
 House, (this being the Lodging House) Mrs Hutton and Gills is very favorable to us,  
 and will no doubt come into the church. After had little to eat. Bro O. Evans  
 and Thos went up to prepare things ready for the meeting. Bro J. T. Evans and myself  
 stayed in the House. We bough were suffering from cold. After the Brethren came  
 back, Bro Thos came with me up to Curnterwyll. We found the Talks all well,  
 I was invited to come up and stay all night. I thanked them, the Boys said they  
 would come down to meeting. Then we departed, when meeting time came we found  
 that nobody knew of it, scercely, so we concluded to postpone it till next night.  
 And I went up to Curnterwyll with David, the eldest son. Had nice chat with  
 the Talks before going to Bed. I slept with David. <sup>1<sup>h</sup></sup> Frid 6. After Breakfast  
 I went down town, met the Brethren, and had good time together, with Mrs  
 Hutton. After dinner we went out and advertised the meeting, all through the  
 Place. I visited some of my Father's Relatives, and acquaintances, had Tea at  
 Mr J. Jones, Father Panson, then I went back to the House, had good time together,  
 untill meeting time. Meeting commenced 7.30. with good adiance, but there <sup>was</sup> few  
 that was bent on disturbing, but were kept down pretty well. Bro A. Evans spoke  
 first - 30 minutes. And I spoke only about 10 minutes. Bro Thos spoke for 35 minutes,  
 and J. T. Evans spoke 20 minutes. We had good meeting, sold two Books of Mor.  
 And had 8 pence in by the People towards paying for the Hall. I went up with  
 David Davis to Curnterwyll. And had very pleasant time in talking to the People,  
 there being a strang Lady there, and she asked me many questions, and I had the  
 priviledg of explaing the principples, and the restoration of the Gospel, untill they all  
 was surprind, all felt good. And then retired with uncle. <sup>1<sup>h</sup></sup> Sat 7. After Breakfast  
 I had a chat with the Boys in the Barn. And then parted with them all, thanked  
 them for their kindness. Blessed them. Met with the Brethren at the House, we soon  
 made ready to start on our journey towards home, Bro J. T. Evans stayed there over  
 Sunday, and we three bid them good by, and blessed them. We came up by Crossinfaen,  
 and up the R.R. towards Llanglythun, we crossed the River upon the Raags. and came



up by High Made, then I parted with the Brethren, and came Home. We staid on the Road, and gave away some Tracts. I found waiting the letter from J. L. Edwards. I was tired, and had been suffering by the effect of the cold that I had the whole week.

Sun 8<sup>th</sup>, I made ready to go to Meeting, to Clifton Furn, but the Brethren did not come over, they were gone to Lampeter. I remained in the House all day, untill Evening. Then about 5 o'clock I went over to Langbyther, to meet the Brethren, and hold our Meeting. We enjoyd ourselves together while sitting together by the fire. We also had Prayers, I being Mouth. We sold Booke of warning to young man that came in. We then repaired to the Meeting Room, light it up and placed the Benches in places, and waited. People were late coming, and it being cold and Rainy, many did not come. We commenced the Meeting something before 8. Bro Thos Prayed, and I spoke first. I alluded to what we had been doing in their midst for long time, that we had preached to them the Gospel in humility, and in the name of the Lord we had testified of its restoration, and had told them what the Gospel are, and that the time had arrived for us to leave them to consider over these things, and act accordingly. And God would be their Judge &c. Spoke only about 20 minutes. Bro Evans spoke for about 10 minutes, and also Bro Thos like manner we sung and closed. I bade the Brethren good by, and came Home.

Mon 9<sup>th</sup>. Raining pretty bad, did intend going to Talgareg. I wrote considerable in the Morning, and in the Afternoon I helped the Folks to carry some Grain into the Barn. and also helped to Thrash, I was stoving away the Straw, and afterwards I helped to clean the Grain with the Flaming Mill. spent the remainder of the Evening in reading.

Tues 10<sup>th</sup>. Again Raining, did considerable writing in the Morning. In the Afternoon Bro Thos came by, and I got ready, and we started for Talgareg, it being very cold, to cross the divide, we called at House, where Mr Thos the Weaver lived, he invited us to stop and have some Tea. We accepted his invitation, and had good time together. We sold him the Booke of Num, he became very interesting in



our remarks, we thanked him for his blessing unto us, and we beseech  
the blessing of the Lord upon him and his family, it was now dark,

and we had much need to have strength, we found Mr. Thomas and family  
well, we were favored with good company, Mr. M., we had good breakfasts,  
and Mr. M. worked at his coat, fixing the collar, and also mended my over  
coat - Brother had new pants, he only change one to home for shipping, and  
3 pairs for hunting, we then started on our return trip, we called at Mr.

one House, spoke to the Lady, of their duty to embrace the Gospel, we had called  
there before, and made good impression upon them, we then continued  
on our way, did not call any place, arrived home early, played a visit in  
the evening to Granddads (Wain) June 12, I wrote a letter to J. & Edward

in the morning, and also went up to Preata, and got my Blankets from  
Sarah Jones, the brooder, she found the Blankets, and fixt them  
up once, she did not change we anything, on the afternoon I carried

the Blankets over to Longlyther and placed them on my feet, and  
putted Edward's letter, Brother and myself took a walk up to see young  
Lady that were sick, Mrs. M., we then returned, Brother and I

Book was a detriment, it was fine for us, I then came home in the dark,  
of the 13, I was home in the morning, some am reading and writing,  
went up to meet the Post, After dinner I came over to Jones, the daler

some gain from the daler, I went over to Longlyther, Bro. M. and  
myself to Little water, with the expectation to have little talk with Mr. James  
the Baptist preacher but he being engaged, we were invited to call that

evening, we also called in other houses, was kindly treated, we then  
came over to Jones, Brother was going away, and thought we would have  
little chat - Brother, bear his testimony to him for the first time he thought



We then parted, Bro Phos going home, I bid him good bye, with the understanding  
 that in Menthys we would meet again. I came home. Sat 14<sup>th</sup>. I wrote a letter  
 to Bro Matthews, our Priest, ordering few Books. after dinner I took little  
 walk up to see the Falls at Partrymawr. was in the field with them for  
 a while. and took little walk round the farm to see it. we then returned  
 to the House. had pleasant scht with Eliza, I had to stop and have some  
 Tea, and then I called at Partry Bedw. Gweno payed me for the Garn.  
 and then I came home. Sun 15<sup>th</sup>. I was suffering from the effect of bad  
 cold, stayed in the House all day, reading the beseret News.  
 Mon 16<sup>th</sup>. I was still down with ~~the~~ cold, did not go far from  
 the house, started to write a letter to ~~my~~ Wife. spent the evening  
 in the House, reading. Tues 17<sup>th</sup>. I am still sick with the cold, wrote and  
 finished my Wife's letter. I also received a Letter from David & my  
 Bro. was very glad to hear from them, and that Henry got over his  
 sickness, I took little walk up to Drefach, set down with Daniel  
 Davis the Tailor. I received one dollar in money from David. Wed 18<sup>th</sup>.  
 I am again feeling unwell. went little errand for the Girl, it being very  
 stormy day. I wrote little in the mornig. I concluded to take little walk  
 little in the afternoon, spent little time with Benjamin Jenkins, the smith,  
 and returned to David Jones, the Store keeper, warmed up, and came Home.  
 Thur 19<sup>th</sup>. I was not nearly well. I went up to Drefach, to meet the Post. I  
 received Letter from Home, with little Hair in it, from each of the little  
 Boys, all well at Home, and the little Boy is walking cross the House. I did  
 not leave the House, in the afternoon, it being very rainy. Frid 20<sup>th</sup>. I  
 am still suffering from the cold, took little walk up to meet the Post.  
 received letter from Bro Phos, from Carmarthen. after dinner I took  
 little walk up to Partry bedw, refused to take anything to eat. did not feel  
 half well, came home. 'very cold bay' in the evening late Mr Samuel Layed Davis,  
 Uncle old friend came, to spend the Hollyday, in hunting. He being a Drummer.



Sat<sup>1</sup> 21. Another very rainy day I feel considerable better today. Uncle and his old friend wanted that I should take little walk ~~with~~ <sup>the</sup> them round country, I went we traveled over considerable ground, did not see anything worth shooting at, but I came across a Trap with a Rabbit in it, and took the Trap along with the Rabbit. Arrived home 2 o'clock. That evening I received letter from 'Dewi' He being well. Sun<sup>2</sup> 22, was home all day except little in the evening, when I took a walk up to see the Post. I kept improving. Mon<sup>3</sup> 23, I spent most the time writing letter to my Bro David. did not leave the house. Tues<sup>4</sup> 24, I finish my letter, and took it over to Larry by then, I also carried over my Wife dress Goods to put in the Bot, I went to see Young Lady that had been sick for long time, Miss Phos. I stayed with them for a long time, they made me to take a cup of Tea. I spoke concerning their duty to become Saints. The Young Lady said that she thought that she would join her she would get strong enough, I promised her if she should exercise faith, and covenant with the Lord to serve Him, that she would get better, to mind not brake it, that the Lord would not be wroked. I blessed her, and came home. I received few Books from Meathys. Wed<sup>5</sup> 25, Christmas Day, I feel pretty well, very fine morning. I remained to home, done some writing in the morning. I took little walk up in the Evening to Breach, and spent the evening with Phos Hughes, they made me take a cup of Tea, had pleasant time. and came home. Thurs<sup>6</sup> 26, After the Post came in, I made my way up to New Court, I called in into the Red Lion Inn, and talked to the People, sold Book of Psor to Mrs the Lady of the House, then I went over to the School Board to see Mr Bowen, sold him Voice of Warning, I was was blessed with some dinner, I then went over to see Mr Philips, the Preacher, but could not sell him my Book, called also in the Store, and returned home. Frid<sup>7</sup> 27, I thought I would go as far as Coedlam Fawr, I stayed while in Dyck Bant, batty with Richerd and the Shoemaker,



then I went on, but instide of going to Coedlanie Paur, I turned  
 down to a Place called Clyn Coch, I gavet them some Tracts, and  
 introduced the Book of Psr, but soon they asked me to take some dinner,  
 and after while Mr Jones bought the Book, I stayed considerable time  
 with him, I then made my way down to the Rabbar, was invited into  
 a House, the Old Lady was acquainted with Father and Mother, spoke to  
 her considerable concerning the Gospel, was invited to have some Tea, but  
 refused, and came on, and gave some more Tracts away, and came on down  
 to New Court, called in at Griffiths Smiths Shop, was made acquaint  
 with a Man, that was newly come home from Sea, I gavet him  
 some Tracts, and also sold him the Voice of Warning, and then came  
 on home. Sat 28<sup>th</sup>, I helped the folks to Thrash in the Morning, and  
 after dinner I wrote letter to Bro Matthews, for some more Books,  
 and helped the folks to clean the Grain the Ballance of the day,  
 Sun 29<sup>th</sup>, I remained in the House all day, it being pretty cold,  
 done some writing and reading. Mon 30<sup>th</sup>, I wrote a letter to my  
 Wife, and was up to brofach, and got Daniel Davis (Tailor) to cut  
 little of my Hair, I came home and started to write a letter to Dewi  
 Tus 31<sup>st</sup>, I went little errand for my Uncle, and after I returned  
 I finished writing to Dewi, I went up to meet the post, received  
 letter from Henry, my Bro. He is now pretty well, I wrote a little  
 more to my Wife, and made ready to start away up to Lampeter by  
 way of Lanybyther, mailed the letters, and went my way, called at  
 Mrs Pros to see how Mary was, went on from there to Mr James the  
 Preacher, I gavet him some something to read, and He could  
 not agree concerning some of the articles of Faith, and we  
 had considerable talk, finally, he wanted me to stay and have  
 some Tea with them, I consented, and we had pleasant conversation  
 when I was going to go, he gave me the Voice of Warning, said



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that he had not read it, but very little, and he thought if he should read it, it would make him worse in place of better. He invited me to call again. I then went on up to Lampeter reaching there after dark, found Margat & John in good health. We stoped up untill the New Year came in, Jan<sup>st</sup> 1. 1890, I remained in Town all day, had considerable talk with dispeard individuals concerning my belief. One were very bitter against my claim of the Book of Mormon. Many came and listen to us. I sold one Bo<sup>k</sup> of Mor, to Mr Davis 'Sailor' but had not the money to pay for it now. I also sold Voice of Warning to the Watchmaker Mr Evans.

Thur<sup>nd</sup> 2. I started away from there about 11 o'clock, turned in and gave away some Tracts in few places. And also introduced the B<sup>k</sup> of Mor. I went by a place called the Ddeymant, to Mr Jones. some Ralitive to J L & C. I we had good time together. I was well treated. He also had a Son, that was nice young man. They thought they prefer the English One. B<sup>k</sup> of Mor I left my Blessing with them. And they thanked me very much for calling. I came on down and called to Farm House called Dolgwrnesa, to Mr Rees, it was now late, I was invited to have some Tea, but could not take any. I showed the B<sup>k</sup> of Mor, and also the Voice of Warning, they bought the last named. I then came on down through Lanybyther, and called at Mr Jones Sailor, and came Home. Frid<sup>d</sup> 3. I concluded to go to Coedlane - Fawr, though it was very cold day, I reached there two o'clock, I was welcomed with young & Ladys, we had very pleasant time together. I showed Margaret some Photos, and gave Her some Tracts, and after Tea I showed her the B<sup>k</sup> of Mor, She bought the Voice of Warning. then I made ready to start towards home. I stoped at Coedlanfach, talked to the folks, and gave them some Tracts, and they were very interesting in the B<sup>k</sup> of Mor.



I started off, it being very late, arrived home alright. Sat. 4<sup>th</sup>. I did not go far, it being very Rainy and cold, was round Breakfast for a while, had some Tea with David & Sarah Jones Parkybede House, and came home. Sun 5<sup>th</sup>. I remained in the House all Day. Mon 6<sup>th</sup>. I remained Home, it being very Rainy Day, and I was not very well. Tues 7<sup>th</sup>. I was round little, took a dose of castor Oil, I did not eat Breakfast, nor Dinner, was up to Mrs Hughes for a while, and in the Smith Shop, came home and took little Tea, my Back has being very lame for a Day or two. Wed 8<sup>th</sup>. I was little better, but kept pretty close, it being very stormy, I did took little walk up to Breakfast, for a while. Thur 9<sup>th</sup>. I am still little better, went up to meet the Post got the Star, stayed at David Jones for a while, and came home, I did not leave as I intended to, for it storm very bad, I done some reading and writing, and arrange my Volume of Star for the Press. Frid 10<sup>th</sup>. I took little walk up to meet the Post, and visited some the sick folks. After Dinner, I carried over to Langbyther some of my underclothing, that I did not use, and also some Books; and placed them in the Box. I went on further to see Miss Phos. She was improving. I stayed and conversed with them for some time, I was requested to take Tea with them; I also visited one of the Neighbours, had little chat about some of the People that had migrate from that neighborhood to Litch. I gived the Young Lady orders to make a memorandum Card for Mother. I gaved them some Practs, and returned home, but called at Mr Jones (Tailor) talked to them for some time, and came on. Sat. 11<sup>th</sup>. I was round in the Morning taking look at the People practising for the Plowing Match. After Dinner I took a walk up to a Place called Synyfron, I was there for some time, had a general talk, Mr Evans was not willing, to receive my docting, tried all
