ail will give no offensive Smoke

A Water for beautifying the face
Take a couple of Calves feet & boil them
in Eighteen Quarts of River Water - to half
the Quantity - Then put in of Rye and
Crumbs of bread steeped in Milk
two pounds & fresh Butter two pounds
and the White of ten new laid Eggs
mix all together & distill - put into the
Distilled Water a little Camphor & alum
and you will have a fine beautifying Wash

To take out Spots on Cloth Stuff &c
Take two pounds of Spring Water - put
in it a little potash (about the quantity
of a Walnut) and a Lemon cut in
small slices. mix this well together
and let it stand for 24 hours in the Sun
then strain it through a Cloth & put the
Clear Liquid up for use this Water take
out all Spots - Whether Sitch grease
or oil - as well in Hats as Cloth stuff
silk Cotton and Linen Immediately
as soon as the Spots are taken off. Wash
the place with Water & when Dry you
will see Nothing

To prevent Iron from rusting
Dip an Iron in an Iron pan and when
brown and thoroughly fixed - express
its oil and put into a phial to
settle and become clear in the sun
Iron Work anointed with this oil will
never rust altho it lay in a damp place

To Etch upon Knives or Razors
Take Mercury and aquafortis put
them together into a glass - till the
Mercury is consumed and it is
fit for use -

To prepare the ground
Get Red lead - White Lead & Chalk
together with varnish and anoint
the Iron - let it dry in the sun
or before a slow fire, and with
a pointed steele or little draw
er write on it what you please
and then Etch it with the above
prepared Water

To make a Quart of Ink —
Take one pint and half a Quartum of
Water - half a Quartum of Wine half
a Quartum of good vinegar - four
ounces of vitriol & four ounces of Galls
(both powdered by themselves) then
mix them together in a glass
vessel - and pour the aforesaid Liquor
upon it - stir it often during so
days or more and when settled
pour it in to a bottle and you
will have very good Ink
